A. Housing at the Golf Course

City Manager Heydlauff recalled that Council discussed the lack of area housing options and had acted on several strategies to create more middle-priced housing. Consistently there has been discussion of whether wooded areas at the Golf Course could be used for housing while maintaining golf. He stated that as we've explored the financial picture of the golf course, this was also a prospect for considering an off-set to the operational losses we regularly experience. As such, the City Attorney reviewed the deeds and records of the course. He noted that pursuant to several provisions of the Charter and state law, the Council cannot consider housing there without approval from the registered voters of the City. This resolution would place the question on the November ballot.

Mayor Kurtz opened the item to public comment and two were heard.

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-07-04
HOUSING DEVELOPMENT BALLOT LANGUAGE

WHEREAS, *the City Council desires to submit a question to the voters as required by Section 2.16 (f) of the City Charter and as provided and permitted by Public Act No. 279 of the Public Acts of 1909, State of Michigan, as amended; and*

WHEREAS, *the City owns certain land within the City limits that is used in part as a golf course, and in part as vacant land; and*

WHEREAS, the City lacks sufficient housing for the residents and workers within the City of Charlevoix; and

WHEREAS, Section 2.16 (f) of the City Charter for the City of Charlevoix provides that "[t]he Council shall not have the power to sell, divide, lease, partition, plat, subdivide, or dispose of any City park or cemetery, or any part thereof, unless specifically approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon at any general or special election, except as provided for in "sub-section h" of this section. 'City park' shall include any property designated as a City park by official action of Council as a 'City park'. Once property is designated as a City park, the designation of property as a City park shall not be removed or changed unless specifically approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon at any general or special election."

WHEREAS, the City Council seeks voter approval to use certain portions of land adjacent to the City golf course that are not being used for golf purposes for year round housing purposes instead; and

WHEREAS, the vacant land in question is on the City's recreation plan and, therefore, requires approval for uses related to housing development under Section 2.16 (f) of the City Charter; and

WHEREAS, The vacant land in question is not used as part of the golf course and the entire golf course will remain as a City owned golf course open to the public for recreation; and

WHEREAS, state law requires that the ballot language be phrased as a question and be no more than 100 words in length; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is required to provide ballot language for the proposed ballot question consistent with state law through adoption by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City Attorney has crafted proposed ballot language that is consistent with the requirements of state law.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Charlevoix City Council hereby adopts the following ballot language for the potential use of a portion of the vacant land adjacent to the golf course and directs the Clerk to take appropriate action to put the question on the ballot for the November 2020 general election:

Shall the City Council for the City of Charlevoix be authorized pursuant to Section 2.16 (f) of the City Charter to allow for the use of certain vacant land that is part of the City's golf course, but is not used for any golf course purposes, to develop and sell or lease year round housing on the vacant land?

B. Charter Amendments Referendum

City Manager Heydlauff recalled that last year, Council reviewed several Charter amendments to present to the voters but ultimately time expired before all of the reviews could be complete by the Attorney General's office. Staff recommended that the following amendments be pursued first:

- Permitting the leasing of land at the airport for hangars for 30 years compared with the current 5 year limitation
- Allowing summaries of ordinances be published in the newspaper rather than the full text so long as the full-text is available online and at City Hall
- Permitting the Clerk to have minutes taken (perhaps by recording) a Board of Review Meetings and permit the Assessor to attend meetings of the Board of Review rather than the current requirement that both persons attend all meetings

He stated that the limitation of five-year leases at the airport has dissuaded potential hangar construction. Publishing full-text ordinances in the newspaper when they are as easily available online recognizes the change in consumer news consumption habits. Allowing the Clerk and Assessor to not attend all meetings of the Board of Review (whose meetings take full days) allows them to be more effective with their time since they can be contacted with questions as needed.

Mayor Kurtz recused himself from the hangar discussion. The City Attorney further explained the Airport land lease limitations.

Deputy Mayor Cole opened the item to public comment and none was heard.

Motion by Hagen, second by Kalbfell to approve Resolution 2020-07-01 Council - Powers and Limitations Ballot Language.

Shall Section 2.16h of the City Charter for the City of Charlevoix be amended to increase the period for which the Council may lease land or buildings for airplane hangars at the City owned airport from 5 to 30 years?
